
- Restrooms and the hospitality area can be found In the education wing, immediately adjacent to the sanctuary. This area is easily accessed from the narthex behind the dividing wall to your far right as you face the sanctuary. In the hospitality area, you can find church information as well as complimentary coffee, tea, hot chocolate, and water.
- You may sit anywhere you like for worship. Unless a pew is marked as
 reserved for worship leaders, all pews are open to anyone. If you are
 concerned our pews do not offer sufficient room or strength for your
 comfort, we have a chair available to offer more room that is rated up to
 500 pounds.
- Worship at FUMC is open to worshipers of all ages. We specifically believe the sounds of children are a beautiful thing in the worship service. Worship bags are available in the narthex by age group, containing different activities to help children during the service. Although all children are welcome to remain in our worship service, there are two other options available. Pastor Melissa will offer a Children's Message during the service at which time she will invite children to come to the front. Following the Children's Message, children from 5 years of age through 5th grade may go with Miss Abigail for Children's Church. They will return to the sanctuary in time to take Holy Communion with their families. A professionally staffed nursery is available for children under 5 years of age, located through the hospitality area. The nursery is available for these children for the entire service, or they may be taken there after the Children's Message.
- We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion each Sunday morning. In the United Methodist Church, we recognize that it is not our place to limit who is invited to the Table of Jesus Christ, so all are welcome. To allow all to participate safely, we have individually sealed communion packets for anyone needing to socially distance or who has a sensitivity to gluten. We will also deliver elements from the table to anyone who has difficulty coming forward.
